<p>Note:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students who are permitted to enroll in senior level (third/fourth year) courses in their selected language by the Faculty of Arts without completing junior level courses are not required to have completed junior level courses in that language. 2. The language proficiency which applicants possess (for example, native speakers of Mandarin or Japanese or Spanish) cannot be used in lieu of course requirements (senior level coursework). 3. Applicants whose first language is one of the modern languages listed here and who completed a degree in a country where the language is the principal language may consult the Teacher Education Office at the UBC Faculty of Education about their language course requirements for admission. 4. When (if) admitted, an applicant presenting German should expect his/her practicum placement to be in a secondary school in Surrey or east of Surrey. 5. When (if) admitted, an applicant presenting Russian should expect to undertake his/her practicum in the West Kootenay area. 6. An applicant with Korean must also prepare a major rather than a concentration in a subject widely taught in BC secondary schools. In the event that a practicum placement for Korean is not possible, the applicant would undertake his/her practicum only in the subject prepared for a major. (This provision is necessary because at present, Korean is not taught in BC secondary schools). 7.
