<p><i>An applicant is normally a holder of a B.Mus. degree and a UBC graduate is normally a holder of a B.Mus. with a major in General Studies (Secondary Education stream).</i></p> <p>1) First and second year music</p> <p>2) 30 credits of third and/or fourth year music</p> <p>A total major must include the following:</p> <p>a) 4 credits of classroom instrumental techniques in two of the following areas: brasses, woodwinds, and bowed string instruments (Class Brasses & Percussion, Class Woodwinds and Class Strings). <p>Admission Average Calculation</p> <p>A minimum average of 65% is required. An applicant normally needs higher than 70% in order to gain admission to the program.</p>	<p>Calculated on 30 credits of music courses relevant to admission, including first/second and third/fourth year level.</p>	
<p>Note:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Faculty strongly recommends that applicants have completed a course in each of instrumental and choral pedagogy prior to admission. If they are unable to complete both or either course prior to admission, students are required to take MUED 302 and/or MUED 303 in addition to their program. The Faculty accepts a Capilano College Bachelor of Music (Jazz Studies) with General Studies – Education Stream degree. Students must take MUED 302 & 303 for their degree completion at Capilano College. Students completing a BA with a major in Music are not normally qualified for admission to the secondary option - Music. They would need to complete the same or similar first, second, third and fourth year level courses in music that are required for completion of the B.Mus with a major in General Studies (Secondary Education Stream) program. In other words, an applicant must have completed the specified areas outlined above as well as a breadth of coursework in music. (http://students.ubc.ca/calendar and click on Chapter IX). Students are advised to complete the 4 credits of classroom instrumental techniques requirement during their four years of the B.Mus degree program because courses to fulfill this requirement are not necessarily offered every year. Normally it is not possible to take such courses during summer session. The French immersion option is not available for Music. <p><i>In addition to course requirements outlined above, the BC College of Teachers requires a minimum of 6 credits in non-performance courses in arts and/or science at 1st/2nd/3rd/4th year level.
